

Scholarship Resources Handout

STEP 1: Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Financial Student Aid) if eligible: Most scholarships require a completed FAFSA to determine financial need. You need to renew your FAFSA each starting on: October 1st – www.fafsa.ed.gov

Apply early each year to get the most free money (Oregon Opportunity Grant, Work Study, etc)!

STEP 2: APPLY FOR...

PCC Foundation Scholarship Application

Offers over 255 scholarships (\$2.20 million a year) for PCC students. *Average award is \$1800, but varies from \$700 to \$5000 a year. The online scholarship application opens November 1st. <u>Applications</u> are due **February 1** at **11:59pm**. <u>www.pcc.edu/scholarships</u>

Oregon Student Access & Completion (OSAC) Scholarship Application

Administers over 600+ private Oregon scholarships (\$10 million annually)! Online application available on November 1. Early Bird Deadline is February 15. Final Deadline is **March 1** at **5pm**. <u>www.oregonstudentaid.gov</u>

Oregon Student Child Care Grant is also available through OSAC

Ford Family Foundation Scholarship (nearly a full-ride scholarship covering the majority of your college costs) Apply for Oregon's largest private scholarship, which pays up to 90% of unmet financial need with a limit of \$40,000 per year (renewable each year). There are three: Ford Opportunity (parents of any age <u>OR</u> adult learners 25 years or older), Ford Transfer (rural HS grad <u>OR</u> current rural community college student), & Ford Scholar (HS or GED student). Opens Nov 1. Deadline is March 1 at 5pm. www.tfff.org

University Scholarships for Transfer Students

If you intend to transfer to a university, check out the scholarship page on the university website. There are many scholarships to look for such as scholarships for transfer students, scholarships for certain majors, diversity scholarships...and more. Many Oregon universities have a *February deadline*.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships (PCC's Honor Society)

Scholarships are the #1 reason students join PTK. To qualify, students must have achieved a 3.5 cumulative GPA or higher and at least 12 credits completed in college level coursework. PTK offers nearly \$1 million in scholarships to help complete an associate degree or prepare for transfer to a four-year college. Fall deadline is **December 1, 2021**, and Spring deadline is TBA. There is a one lifetime membership fee of \$100. Memberships are awarded on a first-come-first serve basis each term. Find a professional association based on your career goals and check for scholarships. (i.e: Society of Women Engineers); also search for corporate sponsors, employers, religious groups, unions, clubs, political parties, etc.

These services ask users to fill out a profile, and then they match users with scholarships that match their skills, interests, and other characteristics.

PCC Essays: Each essay can be up to 350 words. (Some scholarships ask for additional essays to be considered)

- 1. What is your career goal and educational plan to meet this goal? What inspired you to choose this field of study and career?
- 2. What is your greatest strength or characteristic and how will this help you to be successful at PCC?

Ford Family Foundation Essays (150 words each)

- 1. What have you done for your family or community that you care about the most and why? Provide specific examples.
- Describe a topic, idea or concept you find so engaging it makes you lose track of time. Why does it
 interest you and what do you do when you want to learn more?

Describe a skill or ability you have developed that you are proud of. How did you develop it and why is it important to you?

3. What are you known for among people who know you well? What would you like to be known for and how will college help you achieve that? -or-

Think of the place(s) you grew up or consider home. What lessons have you learned living there and how have they shaped who you are today?

OSAC Essays: Must be 1,000 characters in length (about 225 words).

- 1. What are your specific educational plans and career goals and why? What inspires you to achieve them?
- 2. What have you done for your family or community that you care about the most and why?
- 3. Describe a personal accomplishment and the strengths and skills you used to achieve it.
- 4. Describe a significant change or experience that has occurred in your life. How did you respond and what did you learn about yourself?

□ Student Savings Account (matches your savings 1 to 3)

Each \$1 saved is matched by \$3 in matching funds. Savers can use their <u>IDA</u> funds to help pay for college tuition, start or expand a small business, buy a home, or purchase a car, computer, or training to help achieve employment goals. <u>https://oregonidainitiative.org/</u>
