## Standards for showing work and writing conclusions to math problems in MTH 60 Notation is an important part of how we communicate the results to a mathematical problem. Here is a quick reference for how to write your answers for

this course:

Problem Type	Special Notes	How to write your answer	Possible Example (Check with your instructor for how they prefer you to show your work.)
Evaluating an Expression.	Evaluating means you have an expression (there is no equal sign in the statement of what you are asked to do). You will often times see the word "evaluate," "state," or "find."	Show your substitution step and then work out the arithmetic using equal signs before each line to show equivalency of the expressions.	Evaluate $2x^2 + 5x - 3$ for $x = -2$ . If $x = -2$ then $2x^2 + 5x - 3 = 2(-2)^2 + 5(-2) - 3$ = 2(4) - 10 - 3 = 8 - 10 - 3 = -5
Checking to see if a number is a solution to an equation in one variable.	A solution to an equation or inequality is a number which, when plugged into the equation or inequality for the variable, allows for a true statement.	Show your substitution into the equation, working both sides simultaneously, and then state whether the number being tested is or is not a solution.	$\frac{\text{Check } 2x + 5 = 3x - 4 \text{ for } x = 9.}{2(9) + 5 \stackrel{?}{=} 3(9) - 4}$ $18 + 5 \stackrel{?}{=} 27 - 4$ $23 = 23 \qquad \text{Is a true statement.}$ So 9 is a solution to the equation. $\frac{\text{Check } 2x - 4 \le 5x + 1 \text{ for } x = -3.}{2(-3) - 4 \stackrel{?}{\le} 5(-3) + 1}$ $-6 - 4 \stackrel{?}{\le} -15 + 1$ $-10 \le -14 \qquad \text{Is a false statement.}$ So -3 is not a solution to the inequality.

You will often times see the word "solve"	Show your work with your inequality signs lined up in the middle of each inequality. Do not put equal signs on the left. State what the solution is in a sentence and use either set builder or interval notation as asked for in the directions. If there are an infinite number of solutions, communicate this using the "set of all real numbers" symbol.	$\begin{array}{c} \underline{\operatorname{Solve} 2 - w \leq 4 \text{ for } w.} \\ 2 - w \leq 4 \\ 2 - w - 2 \leq 4 - 2 \\ -w \leq 2 \\ \frac{-w}{-1} \geq \frac{2}{-1} \\ w \geq -2 \end{array}$ So every number greater than or equal to -2 is a solution and the solution set is $\{w   w \geq -2\}$ . OR So every number greater than or equal to -2 is a solution and the solution set is $[-2, \infty)$ . $\begin{array}{c} \underline{\operatorname{Solve} w + 2 \leq w + 4 } \\ w + 2 - w \leq w + 4 \\ w + 2 - w \leq w + 4 - w \\ 2 \leq 4 \\ \mathrm{So every real number is a solution and the solution set is \mathbb{R}. \end{array}$ OR So every real number is a solution and the solution set is $(-\infty, \infty)$ .
		If there is no solution, communicate this using either of the empty set symbols.	$\begin{array}{l} \underline{\text{Solve } w + 4 \leq w + 2 \ \text{for } w.} \\ w + 4 \leq w + 2 \\ w + 4 - w \leq w + 2 - w \\ 4 \leq 2 \\ \text{So there are no solutions and the solution set} \\ \text{is } \{\}. \\ \text{OR}  \text{So there are no solutions and the solution set} \\ \text{is } \emptyset. \end{array}$

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Solving word problems.	These problems will generally describe a situation and a relationship between two variables with units defined for each variable.	Write your answer as a complete sentence, giving a contextual conclusion which answers the question being asked.	If a rock falls from a height of 20 meters on Earth, the height $H$ , in meters, $x$ seconds after it began to fall is approximately $H = 20 - 4.9x^2$ . What is the height of the rock 1 second after beginning its fall? $H = 20 - 4.9(1)^2$ H = 20 - 4.9 H = 15.1 The height of the rock 1 second after beginning its fall is approximately 15.1 meters.
Rectangular Coordinate System Guidelines.	Remember, the graph is a picture of the solutions to the equation. The horizontal-axis (often the x-axis) and vertical-axis (often the y axis) are the coordinate system or coordinate plane which we draw the graph onto.	Label your <i>horizontal</i> and <i>vertical</i> axes (often $x$ and $y$ ) with an appropriate scale, label the line with its equation and any points required by your instructor (often the vertical intercept and sometimes others).	Graph the equation $y = 2x - 3$ . The slope is $m = \frac{2}{1}$ and the y-intercept is $(0, -3)$ . y y y y y y y y y y
