*Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7*

### OUR ALTAR ROSARY SOCIETY

Immaculate Conception's Altar Rosary Society has been an instrumental part of our parish for the past 101 years. Since its founding, many generations have come together to provide a variety of services. At present, the Society buys linens for the altar, vestments for the priest, and hosts for communion. Members faithfully rotate each week to launder the towels and purificators used at Mass.

Last year the angels that sit near the altar were refurbished through our Altar Rosary Society donations.

Another important service of our Altar Rosary Society is to provide funeral luncheons for the families and friends of our deceased parishioners. This involves many people within our parish. There are 21 committees that provide casseroles, salads, and desserts for the meals. Members of these committees also prepare the hall and serve the food the day of the funeral. Altar Rosary Society also provides sandwiches, beverages, condiments, chips, and place settings. There is a minimal charge to the family for this service. Altar Rosary Society appreciates so much all of the ladies (and occasionally there are a few gentlemen) that help with the meals. From time to time, members of committees are no longer able to help, so new members are always needed. Ladies are generally called upon just 2 or 3 times a year to bring a dish and if possible to help set up and serve. Hopefully this service will be reinstated after pandemic ends.

This is a wonderful opportunity to become more involved in your church community, meet people, make new friends, and help provide a service to those dealing with the loss of a loved one.

Once a year, there is an envelope in the January packet that can be returned with a donation to help Altar Rosary Society continue to be vital and supportive to our parish. All women of our parish are members, whether or not they have given this donation. Financially Altar Rosary Society functions through these donations along with funeral luncheon donations.

Taxpayers who don't itemize deductions may take a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made in 2020 to qualifying organizations. For our purposes of this deduction, ICC is a qualifying religious organization. The law changed in this area due to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act. The CARES Act also temporarily suspends limits on charitable contributions. For any registered parishioner who has made an offertory donation in 2020 a contribution statement will be mailed to them by the end of January 2021.

### **A MESSAGE FROM FATHER GASE**

My Dear Parishioners,

I thought I would bring you up to speed on some minor enhancements to our beautiful church building:

- You may have noticed a new sanctuary lamp just to the right of the tabernacle. It actually is not new; I found it in the sacristy a few months ago and Gary Taylor mounted it on the wall. It is much larger than what we had been utilizing and will announce to all who enter the church that our Lord is truly present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the tabernacle.
- You also may have noticed that a bell has been mounted near the main entrance to the church. It also is not new; I found it in the sacristy and Gary installed it. After looking at some older pictures of our church it appears to have been mounted behind the sanctuary next to the door leading to the old sacristy before the church was renovated. It's great that this bell will call us to worship once again!
- Thanks to a generous bequest the smaller statue of the Blessed Mother which is used for May crowning and makes a special appearance on Marian feast days has gone away to Henninger's in Cleveland for a much needed refurbishment. Henninger's is the same firm that restored the large angel statues which flank the altar. The golden crucifix on the altar will also be going to Henninger's for some minor cleaning and restoration (you may have noticed that it has a bit of a "lean." It is an absolutely beautiful piece of patrimony of our parish, and both Fr. Jonathan and I have appreciated being able to focus on it while praying the Mass. The same bequest will enable it to be restored.
- At some point I would like to have some pedestals made for our angel statues in order to give them a proper place in the sanctuary. As you can imagine, having them continue to be on the floor will subject them to damage. If you enjoy woodworking and are interested in helping with this project please contact me.

We are the fortunate recipients of a beautiful church which has been well maintained throughout the years. *Several* priests have commented to me that they are jealous because I have the good fortune of celebrating Mass at our beautiful marble altar. We are indeed blessed!
